#### Winter School Closings

When school is closed due to weather please DO NOT call the school. We will follow the lead of the Sheboygan Area School District for weather related closings – if they close, we will also. If the public schools dismiss two hours early or start two hours late, we will also. Please note: if we close early all students must be picked up as Extended Care will also close. In the event of a two-hour delay there will be no 3K or 4k classes that day. If the public schools stay in session Bethlehem will usually also stay open.

The quickest way to receive closing alerts from Bethlehem is to subscribe to our text alert. To subscribe log into your Sycamore account, go to "My school", "My Notifications", select the "Primary Parent" from the drop-down menu (we are only able to add one number per family). Make sure the "Enable Messaging" box is checked and then select the correct cell phone number (including area code) in the "SMS". Select your carrier and "school closing notifications". Update using the blue "Update" button in the upper right corner.

Other options include checking the Sycamore homepage, the Bethlehem Facebook page, and Twitter. We will also send an email to families that have provided us with a current email address.
