What will your child learn?

1. Religion: to develop the knowledge that Jesus is the child's personal Savior and that God is the Creator and Giver of everything; to promote living as a child of God; to promote the child's awareness of Bible stories, hymns, songs, and Bible passages.

2. Reading/Language Development: to provide experiences with books and the printed word through story time and individual exposure; to promote experience in receptive and expressive use of language and language patterns; to develop auditory perception skills; to provide experiences with the organization of print and discrimination between units of the written word; to develop a positive attitude toward reading, speaking, and the printed word; to correctly identify all capital and lower case letters of the alphabet at random; and to identify initial consonant sounds.

3. Mathematics: to provide experiences with the concepts of classification, comparison, patterns, and numbers through concrete application and examples.

4. Socialization Skills: to promote children working together productively in group settings and an organization context.

Age of Eligibility
