Mr. Klug's Corner

During yesterday's chapel service, I focused on James 3 and the power of our words. Our tongues should not be used to praise God one moment and then hurt others the next. Using the examples of the bit in a horse's mouth and the rudder on a ship, I showed how something small can have great influence, just like the words that come from our tongue. I also reflected on the familiar saying, "Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words will never hurt me." It is only partly true. Sticks, stones, and WORDS can hurt us. A paper heart was folded as examples of hurtful words that were given by the students. It was unfolded as examples of apologies and words of encouragement were give. After it was completely unfolded, the heart was full of creases and marks. That's what happens when we use our tongue to hurt others. But the story doesn't end there. The sticks remind us of the cross, where Jesus took on our sins, and the stones remind us of the stone rolled away from the tomb, declaring victory over sin, death, and the devil. It is a powerful reminder that our words should reflect the love and grace of Christ.


