From the desk of Pastor Niles

Working While We Wait

"Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain." — 1 Corinthians 15:58

Advent is a season that teaches the Church how to wait. We rehearse Israel's long expectation for the Messiah, and at the same time we join the saints of every age in watching for Christ's return in glory. But Christian waiting is never passive. Scripture does not call us to sit with folded hands, watching the clock until Jesus comes again. Advent is not a season to just sit and remember with nostalgia the events and feelings of the past. Instead, Scripture calls us to a *hopeful*, *active*, *joyful* waiting—one that lives out Christ's love in the present moment. Advent is not just about waiting. It is about expectant preparation.

St. Paul reminds the Corinthian church that because Christ is risen—and because His return is certain—our work in His name is never wasted. The Lord who came once in humility and who will come again in glory continues to work through His people today. Advent



waiting, therefore, is not idle; it is expectant and diligent. It is the life of those who know their Savior is near. Just as there are preparations to be made as we wait for holiday gatherings with friends and families, there are preparations and work for us to do as we wait on Christ to return.

We have a lot of work to do as the people of God at Bethlehem. In this season we take stock of our lives, our congregation, our families, and our callings. Where has God placed us to serve? Whom has He put in our path to love? What gifts has He entrusted to us for the building up of His Church? Every visit to the homebound, every act of mercy, every hour given to preparing the sanctuary, every gift and donation, every word of encouragement shared in Christ's name—none of it is forgotten by the Lord. These are not small things. They are Advent things.

And so, as we light the candles and pray, "Come, Lord Jesus," we also take up the work He has given us to do. Not to earn His favor—He has already come to us in grace—but because He has made us His own and filled us with hope. Until the day He appears again, we labor in confidence, knowing that our service is anchored in the promise of His resurrection and the certainty of His return.

May this Advent season renew our anticipation, strengthen our faith, and encourage us to abound in the work of the Lord as we wait for the One who comes to make all things new.

Come quickly, Lord Jesus.



Twenty Families in an Aisle: When God Opens a Mission Field in Walmart

Not long ago, I experienced something that reminded me why the Lord calls us to go out, to walk, to seek, and to speak the Gospel everywhere. One day I went to the Walmart in Sheboygan with a handful of business cards, some church flyers... and a heart willing to listen and to serve.

I didn't have a perfect plan. There wasn't an organized event. I only had the conviction that Jesus sends His servants to where the people are.

For three hours I walked through those aisles: through toys, vegetables, the bakery, electronics, cleaning supplies... ordinary places where almost no one would expect the Holy Spirit to be at work. But God has no limits.

That day, I met twenty new families. Twenty faces, twenty stories, twenty voices full of hope and pain. And to my surprise... they were all Venezuelan families.

Some had just arrived; others didn't know anyone; most were searching for stability, community, a place where their children are safe, and a warm embrace in the middle of so much change. But deeper than all of that... they carry a longing that only Christ can fill, even if they don't yet know how to express it.

Between aisles, shopping carts, and timid smiles, I was able to hand out cards, share information about our church, and above all... share the Gospel. Right there, in Walmart, in the heart of Sheboygan.

Because the Gospel is not tied to a building or limited to a schedule. The Gospel walks, seeks, listens, embraces, and is proclaimed in every place and to every tongue.

That day, I understood something very deep: our ministry isn't passive—we don't wait for the Hispanic community to come to us. The community is already here, and that's exactly why we go to them wherever God leads us... even to Walmart. Into the places where they live, shop, work, and learn. They need to hear Christ crucified and risen. They need a church that loves them, welcomes them, and walks beside them.

But this work cannot be done alone. Behind every conversation, every card handed out, and every family reached, God is at work—and so are the people who pray, support, donate, and believe that He is doing something great among the Hispanics of Sheboygan County.

That's why I invite you to join this mission. To be part of what God is doing. To support a ministry that goes out, that moves, that knocks on doors... and shares the love of Jesus where you least

expect it.

Because if God can open a mission field in the aisles of Walmart, imagine what He can do with your support, your prayers, and your generosity.

The twenty families I met that day are only the beginning. With your help, we can reach many more. Christ is already at work. The harvest is ready. And you can be part of this beautiful mission.

Thank you for taking the time to read this letter and thank you for your continued support of our Hispanic Ministry. Thank you for partnering with us in this mission. Please continue to keep us in your prayers. May God richly bless you for your generosity, your love, and your faithfulness. We look forward to all that the Lord has in store for us!


