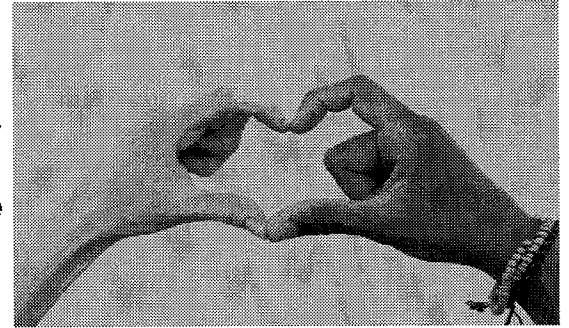

FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR NILES

Love: Noun or Verb?

"I love you!" We hear this statement often. We say this statement often. Do we ever truly think about what it means? So often in our society, we think of love as an emotion. It is a noun in much of our speak. It is something we feel. It is something into or out of which we fall. It is something that is outside of ourselves that we seek to possess. However, when we look at love in the Scripture, we get a very different picture of love. Take a look at the following passages to start this conversation.

"In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another." ~ 1 John 4:9-11~



"Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, so that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish." ~ Ephesians 5:25-27~

In these passages, we see that love is not a noun. It is a verb. It is action. For Christians, the action of love begins with the love that is shown to us in the work of Jesus Christ. Our heavenly Father loves us by sending His Son to die for our sins... to be our sacrifice. Our heavenly Father does not merely possess love for us. He loves us in action. He redeems us so that we might be worthy of eternal life with Him. Love is seen in Christ dying for us. Love is seen in the actions of sacrifice, forgiveness, and care.

In Ephesians 5, Paul reiterates this reality when he discusses how husbands should love their wives. It is not a simple statement of an emotional state. It is an active work for the sake of someone else. Our active love for others always flows from the love and grace that we receive from Christ. As we progress through February, remember that you are a steward of the love of God... a steward of the actions of God to other people. May God continue to use you through loving others!

A MESSAGE FROM THE SCHOOL OFFICE.....

Dear Bethlehem Lutheran Church & School families,

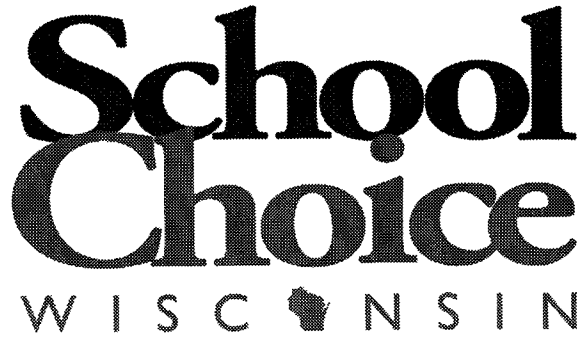
Bethlehem Lutheran School will be again participating in the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program for the upcoming 2023-2024 school year. The Wisconsin Parental Choice Program (WPCP) provides children throughout the state with a full tuition voucher to attend the private or religious school of their choice. You will attend BLS for free if given a voucher.

This program allows families in the Sheboygan area to access the educational program at Bethlehem Lutheran, especially those families who in the past might not have been able to afford to attend.

Bethlehem will be accepting applications in grades 4K to 8th for parents who wish to enroll their children at the school through the WPCP. Student applications for the WPCP can be submitted online from February 1- April 15, 2023 at <https://sms.dpi.wi.gov/ChoiceParent/> There is also a link that can be found on our website www.ourbethlehem.com.

The program currently is limited to those families with incomes below 220% of the federal poverty level. So what does that number look like? Your adjusted gross income (AGI) would need to be at or below the levels listed below for the size of your family

For each additional member add \$10,384

Here is how the process works:

1. The parent or guardian logs into the online parent application.
2. Once logged in, the application will take the parent to an instruction page on how to verify the email address.

The parent's instructions read as follows:

- a. You need to verify your email address for the Private School Choice Program Online Application.
 - b. Go to the inbox for your email account for: "email address@email.com"
 - c. Click the "Confirm Email Address" link in the email to confirm your email address.
3. Once the parent clicks the "Confirm Email Address" link in the email, the link will take the parent to the email verification confirmation page where it notifies the parent that their email address has been verified.
 4. On the email verification confirmation page, the parent will be instructed to click on a link to return to the online parent application log-in page where the parent will need to enter his or her email and password to continue the application process.

You will also find a financial aid application for those who may not qualify for the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program. We want to make Christian Education something that you can afford.

- ◆ Have their business promoted via our social media platforms (Facebook & Instagram).

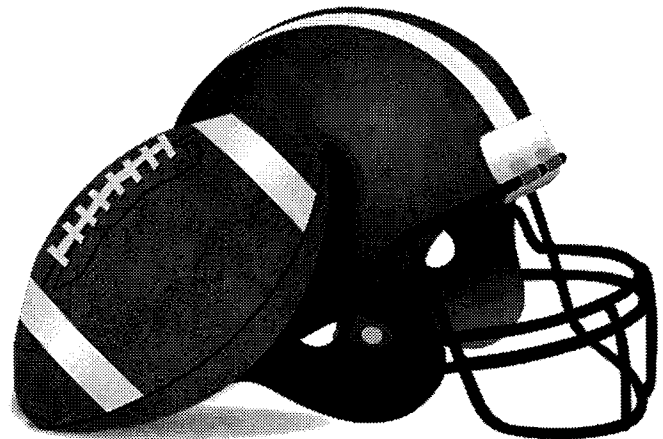

SITE REVIEW COMMITTEE
Jan 10, 2023
6:00 PM

Members Present - Bob Irish, Steve Kress, Dave Strohschoen, Keeli Johnson, George Haecker, Sherry Baalke, Alice Brown and Sue Kubow.

1. Opening Prayer – The committee joined together in the Lord’s Prayer
2. Minutes – Initial meeting - no minutes
3. Financials – No financial report given
4. Old Business – There was no old business
5. New Business
 - a. We collected members contact information
 - b. Scope and objective of Committee – Bob Irish – asked members to look at our site as a clean slate with the exception of our current footprint. Look at all areas to include but not limited to SE land development, landscaping, signage, garage location, green space, student drop off and pickup, facility safety, parking, storage, solar power, adding additional space to building, office space for DCE, purchasing additional property, possible relocation of school office if main drop off area would change, extended care remote door lock system with app., fencing, etc. Dave Strohschoen developed his thoughts with a drawn plan. His ideas will be considered at a future meeting.

Note: In 2005 an I-beam was placed in the south wall of the gym/cafeteria entrance so we could expand our building to the south. We also have electrical stubbed out to the east parking lot and we believe our storm water drains in the parking lot are set to add more drainage from expanding our parking lot south. Currently, there is money in our 2023 budget to handle payments on an additional \$100,000 loan.
 - c. Working Documents – The committee was asked to review our Vision 2021 – 2023. To review the document, go to ourbethlehem.com website, then to administration/documents. The Accreditation summary’s last page was handed out to all committee members. Safety of dropping off and picking up of students and the signage with a cross were highlighted. A footprint of our existing building was asked for by the committee. We will get one and distribute it. A 2003 architect drawing of the SE entrance was handed out as a review of what was planned if we bought the Jackett property.
 - d. Process – The committee was asked over the next week to talk with others and submit additional ideas to consider. We will set up listening sessions with members and staff to get additional input. The general plan at this time is to identify needs and prioritize them. Once this is done, we would need to hire and meet with an architect to develop a master plan. That plan could be implemented all at once or done in phases.
 - e. Time Line – We will develop a timeline.
 - f. Possible Resolutions needed – to hire an architect, approve plan, get financing and hire contractors. The consensus of the committee was to look for an architect to develop a master plan based on our priorities. This would require the support of the PPC and an approval of a resolution from the Voting Assembly. We have a Voter’s meeting coming up in January or we could ask for a special Voter’s meeting to have a resolution approved. A short discussion on financing was brought up and moved to a future meeting.
6. Next meeting date – To be determine within the next two weeks.
7. Adjournment

Our cash position at the end of August stands at \$248,683 and our general accounts payable is up to \$61,277. Adult envelopes came in a little over our estimated monthly projections at \$72,535. We received a WI Voucher check for tuition. Comparing our net income against 2021 we are up \$49,000 at \$105,360. That's a good thing!

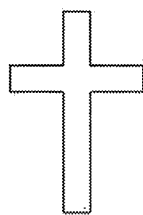
