Welcome to Table Talk with Pastor Hanson! Pull up a chair and let's talk about what it means to grow in Christian Discipleship.

“Discipleship in the Light of Christ’s Epiphany”

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The month of January brings us into the season of Epiphany—*a season of revealing*. Christ is made known to the nations. The Light of the world shines into every darkness. And as the light of Christ is revealed, something else becomes clear as well: **what it means to follow Him.**

This year, the lectionary gives us four consecutive Sundays—Second Sunday after Christmas through the Third Sunday after the Epiphany—that beautifully reveal different dimensions of **Christian discipleship**.

Second Sunday after Christmas — Christ Our Wisdom (Ephesians 1:3–14; Luke 2:40–52)

We hear of the boy Jesus in the temple, “*growing in wisdom and in stature and in favor with God and man.*” In a world that chases after many kinds of wisdom, Epiphany begins by reminding us that **true wisdom is found in Christ alone.**

Discipleship begins with being shaped by His Word.

Just as Jesus was found in His Father’s house, hearing and speaking the Word, so also our discipleship takes root in regular worship, Scripture study, and prayer. We follow Christ by listening to Him.

The Baptism of Our Lord — Discipleship Begins in Baptism (Matthew 3:13–17)

At Jesus’ baptism, the heavens open, the Spirit descends, and the Father declares, “*This is My beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.*”

Our discipleship—our walking with Jesus—**begins in our baptism**, where we are united with Him, adopted by the Father, and filled with the Holy Spirit.

In a new year filled with resolutions, this Sunday calls us to remember the identity we already have:

- You are baptized.
- You belong to Christ.
- You walk in newness of life.

Discipleship is not self-improvement. It is living daily from the promises God has already spoken over us.

Second Sunday after the Epiphany — Called to Witness (John 1:29–42a)

“Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!”

John declares Jesus openly, and the first disciples follow because someone **bore witness**.

Discipleship includes **inviting others to meet Jesus**.

Andrew brings Peter. The Church brings her children. Christians bring their neighbors, their friends, and even casual acquaintances. The Epiphany light is never meant to be hidden—it is shared. When we speak of Christ, serve in His name, or simply express our hope in Him, we participate in the ancient pattern of disciples calling others into the light.

Third Sunday after the Epiphany — Called to Follow (Matthew 4:12–25)

Jesus calls fishermen from their nets: *“Follow Me.”*
And immediately they do.

Here discipleship appears in its simplest and clearest form: **hearing Jesus’ call and responding with trust**.

To follow Jesus means letting His Word set our direction, His forgiveness lighten our burdens, and His mission shape our priorities. For some of us, that means renewed commitment to worship and Bible study. For others, it means stepping into service, restoring relationships, or simply taking the next step in faith.

A January Invitation: Let This Be a Month of Renewed Discipleship

In this Epiphany season, Christ reveals Himself—and as He does, He reveals the path of discipleship:

Wisdom in His Word (Luke 2)

Identity in Baptism (Matthew 3)

Witness to the world (John 1)

Following His call (Matthew 4)

As a new year begins, I invite you to recommit to walking this path together as the body of Christ.

If you have stepped away from Bible study, return.

If you have grown weary in prayer, begin again.

If your worship attendance has slipped, come back and join us in the house of your Father.

If you are not serving, ask how you might use your gifts for the good of the kingdom.

Discipleship is never a solo journey. Christ calls us to follow **together**, in the fellowship of His Church, shaped and strengthened by His Word and Sacraments.

May the light of Christ revealed in this Epiphany season shine brightly on your path, now and throughout the year.



The Lord continues His marvelous work through His Holy Sacraments, and we rejoice in seeing His grace at work in our community!




Let us celebrate together the promise of baptism: that in Christ, we are all children of God, forgiven, loved, and called to shine His light in the world.

Calling All Potential Small Group Leaders!




