Welcome to Table Talk with Pastor Hanson! Pull up a chair and let's talk about regular Bible study and devotion and how they are essential for growing in faith, as the Holy Spirit continues to guide us into the truth of Christ through God's Word.

Growing in the Word: The Importance of Bible Study and Devotion

Based on John 16:12-15

As we enter the month of May, a season of growth and renewal, it is fitting to reflect on the importance of growing in our faith through Bible study and devotion. Jesus' words in John 16:12-15 remind us of the vital role of the Holy Spirit in guiding us into all truth:

"I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, for he will take what is mine and declare it to you. All that the Father has is mine; therefore I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you."

In this passage, Jesus prepares His disciples for the time when He will no longer be with them in the flesh. He promises that the Holy Spirit, the "Spirit of truth," will continue to lead them in understanding His Word. This promise is not only for the disciples but for all believers, including us today. Through the Scriptures, the Spirit continues to work in our hearts, opening our minds to God's truth and deepening our faith in Christ.

The Necessity of Bible Study

Jesus acknowledges that there is always more to learn: "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now." His disciples had spent years in His presence, hearing His teachings and witnessing His miracles, yet they were not yet ready to fully grasp all that He had to reveal. If this was true for them, how much more is it true for us?

Bible study is essential because we, too, have much to learn. God's Word is not just a collection of ancient writings but a living testimony of His grace, revealing His plan of salvation through Christ. Regular engagement with Scripture helps us understand who God is, who we are in relation to Him, and how we are to live as His redeemed people.

Moreover, the Bible is not a book we can master in one reading. Each time we open it, the Holy Spirit works in us, revealing new insights, convicting us of sin, strengthening our faith, and equipping us to live as God's children in a fallen world. Without the discipline of Bible study, we risk being led astray by the falsehoods of the world and our own sinful nature.

The Blessing of Daily Devotion

Bible study, while necessary, must also be accompanied by daily devotion. Devotion is not merely an academic exercise but a time of personal reflection and prayer, in which the Word of God is applied to our hearts and lives. Jesus tells us that the Spirit "will take what is mine and declare it to you." The Holy Spirit takes the truth of Christ and makes it real and personal for us.

In daily devotion, we meditate on Scripture, allowing it to shape our thoughts, attitudes, and actions. We pray in response to God's Word, seeking His guidance, strength, and peace. Through devotion, we grow in our relationship with God, learning to trust in His promises and walk in His ways.

Encouragement for Our Congregation

In today's fast-paced world, it is easy to neglect time in the Word. But as Jesus reminds us, there is always more to learn, and the Holy Spirit is always ready to guide us. May we be a congregation committed to studying the Scriptures and spending time in devotion, trusting that through His Word, God continues to shape us into His faithful people.



Questions Answered: A Layperson's Take on Group Bible Study

Greetings in the name of our risen Savior Jesus Christ

Christians throughout the ages have been plagued with questions regarding what the Bible says, and what they think it says. We, at Bethlehem Lutheran Church, are blessed with Synodically-trained and ordained pastors who, through our worship services, walk us through the Old Testament, the epistle, and the gospel readings in the sermon.

Sermons are our pastor's venue for teaching and explaining the days sermon text typically taken from either the epistle or the gospel. Every week, we hear the Word, and have it explained through the sermon. Hopefully, explanations such as these help answer questions that may arise from that day's readings.

As Christians, we are encouraged to spend time in His word by reading the Bible individually or through family devotions. Romans 10:17 says, "Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ." In John 1:1, he tells us "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." Every time you have an opportunity to hear the Word, you are hearing God. Think of it as having the Father, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit sitting next to you, and giving you hope.

Isn't it amazing how one can read a particular verse or passage three or four times, and then, suddenly, you discover something that you never caught before?


Personal study of the scriptures is essential for one's personal spiritual growth. However, that is not where spiritual growth should end.

Bible studies led by our pastors, Synodically-trained teachers, and lay leaders whose subject is guided by our pastor's aid, is yet another dimension to one's spiritual growth. In Matthew 4:4, Jesus answered, "man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God."

Acts 2:42 tells us in the early church, "Christians devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of read and to prayer". Teaching and fellowship seemed to have gone together and it still does today.

Bible studies are time well spent by first having heard God's Word, and given ample opportunity to ask questions regarding the subject and word at hand. In addition, and perhaps even more important is the opportunity to ask a pastor questions that arose during daily devotions and reading of scriptures.

Everyone is cordially invited to attend any of Bethlehem's weekly Bible study opportunities. Give it a try, you won't be disappointed.




