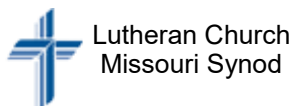

FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR NILES

He is Risen - So Don't Be So Serious!

Caveat: Please read this article with the intent in mind! It is not meant to say that our faith is a joke. It is the most serious of items in our life. Because the truths of our faith are serious, it also means that there is room for joy and levity. Joy and levity are gifts of God also! So breathe!

Now on the first day of the week Mary Magdalene came to the tomb early, while it was still dark, and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." So Peter went out with the other disciple, and they were going toward the tomb. Both of them were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. And stooping to look in, he saw the linen cloths lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen cloths lying there, and the face cloth, which had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen cloths but folded up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the Scripture, that he must rise from the dead. Then the disciples went back to their homes. ~John 20:1-10~

I have always found this passage amusing. Throughout his gospel account, John never names himself in the account. He always refers to himself as "the other disciple" or "the disciple that Jesus loved". There could be numerous reasons for this about which many commentaries have spilled a lot of ink. I only bring this up to show that the two disciples that run to the tomb are Peter and John. In the middle of the most important part of his gospel account, John takes an aside to mention the fact that he beat Peter in the race to the tomb. Why would John add this to the account. It seems frivolous. It seems that, as the youngest of the disciples, he is kind of taunting Peter a little bit. However, I find it fascinating that in the midst of all that transpired during the previous days, John finds this as something worth mentioning in the light of Jesus' resurrection.

The disciples had been put through the wringer during the last weeks of Jesus' life on earth. They had seen their rabbi, teacher, confidant, friend, and the one whom they thought to be the Messiah put to death by the ones from whom He was supposed to rescue them. And He died one of the most grotesque, agonizing, and humiliating execution methods in the history of mankind. They spent the hours since His death worried that the same would happen to them. However, when they arrived at the tomb, they saw that He was alive. The linens were not strewn across the tomb as if grave-robbers had just ransacked the tomb. They were organized and neatly folded as if someone took great care in taking them off. The account of Mary was true. That means that He really did appear to her. He really was alive. He had risen from the dead! An excitement and joy had started to rise within them. So as John recounts this most important event in his gospel, he does not recount the sorrow, anxiety or worry. There was only one emotion that he remembered - joy. It allowed him to remember with humor, joy, and levity that he had beat Peter to the tomb, and now it is memorialized in Christian theology.

We do not know this for sure. John does not include his motives in including this information. The fact that this could be a possible explanation should mean a lot for us. It means that, as Christians, we have a reason for levity, joy, and humor. The source of this reason is the fact that Christ has risen! He has risen, indeed! Alleluia! No matter what context we find ourselves in, we have do not need to be downcast, anxious, worried, gloomy, or depressed about our world or our lives, because Christ has conquered sin, death, and those things that distress us! We can smile. We laugh. We can make jokes. We can have joy as people for whom Christ died and rose! So this Easter, don't be so serious! Remember that John took time to gloat that he won the Resurrection Run! Take some time to have fun with the people of God, because we will be together for eternity! **He is risen! He is risen, indeed! Alleluia!**

FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR MOON

Shout for Joy

I came across an interesting article the other day, and I would like to share some findings.

A study was published in 1999 by two people named Martin and Kuiper. They reported that laughter is 30 times more likely when people are together as opposed to if they are alone. The conclusion they were willing to draw from this information is that laughter is a social activity and furthermore that joy is meant to be shared.

Now I have no idea if Martin or Kuiper are Christians or not, but for myself this comes as no surprise. When Paul talks over and over again about the way Christians are supposed to share in their joy and sorrow, happiness and hardship, it makes sense that these are behaviors that even gentile-pagans would notice in people. In other words: we were designed that way. God intended us to live in community in these ways.

In the same article, another study (this time published by Bainum, Lounsbury, and Pollio in 1984) says that the same type of analysis is true of children. Only 5% of smiles or laughs occurred when a child is alone. The remaining 95% occur when children are together. Again the conclusion to be drawn from this information is that joy is meant to be shared.

I would also like to add to their findings. These are anecdotal of course, but my observations on the playground at schools throughout the years are filled with laughter and joyful shouts. Why do the little children shout on the playground? As long as they haven't fallen off the swings or the monkey bars it's because they are overflowing with joy, and something inside themselves (that they probably don't even notice, and couldn't explain) wants to share it with their friends.

The following passage is from Psalm 33:

Shout for joy in the Lord, O you righteous! Praise befits the upright. Give thanks to the Lord with the lyre; make melody to him with the harp of ten strings! Sing to him a new song; play skillfully on the strings, with loud shouts.

I am convinced that this passage is meant for the assembly. The Hebrew grammar of this passage is in full support of this. "O you righteous" is plural. It could also be translated as "All you righteous people". It is certainly a wonderful thing to sing praises while you're alone in the car or the shower, but the people of God are at their most joyful when they are with their brothers and sisters in Christ.

As we march closer to the cross of Good Friday and the glorious resurrection of Easter Sunday, let us continue to share in mourning our sins, but let us not neglect or forget to share in our joy. It's good for us, and furthermore it's how our Gracious Father created us.

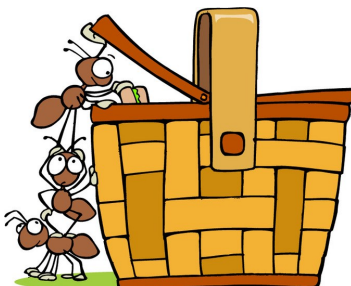

DIVE INTO A LOOK AT SELDOM-STUDIED EARLY CHURCH FATHERS

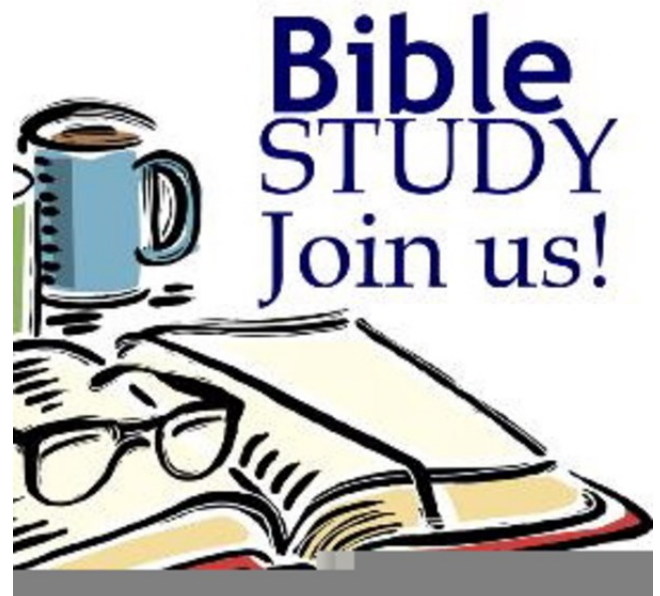
