

### FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR NILES

### Forward and Backward - The Life of a Christian

For the Lord himself will descend from heaven with a cry of command, with the voice of an archangel, and with the sound of the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air, and so we will always be with the Lord. Therefore encourage one another with these words. (1 Thessalonians 4:16-18)

Have you ever noticed that we as humans are not content with the present?

We are so eager to live in the past and dwell in our "glory days". We are equally ready to look ahead to our

future and wish the present away for the sake of what the future might hold. We rarely are ok with just living in the present context of our lives. This is far from a personal mindset. This is a mindset that affects many people on a daily basis. As Christians, we are called to live in the present with a trust in our God who provides for all that we need for this body and life. As Christians, we are also called to look at the past and remember the promises of our faithful God. As Christians, we are also called to look ahead to the fulfillment of the promises that God makes to each and every one of us. As Christians, we are called to live with an eye to all three of these time periods. This is vividly shown during the season of Advent.



In Advent, our attention is drawn to the anticipation of the Old Testament people of God awaiting the promised Messiah. They awaited the Messiah and all He was promised to do. God told promised His people that the Messiah would restore the relationship between them and their Creator that was severed in the fall of Adam and Eve. When Jesus is born, He was born as the hope of Israel. God's plan to save humanity was wrapped in swaddling cloths and laid in a manger. Just as God had fulfilled every promise to His people in the Old Testament, this baby was the fulfillment of His greatest promise. This promise was not only to the Old Testament people but it was made to us also. This baby would save us from our sins in His death and resurrection.



In Advent, our attention is also drawn forward to the hope that still awaits us. That babe in Bethlehem who died, rose, and ascended is also coming (adverting) again at the end of time. At that time, all of the promises that God has made to us in Christ, will be fulfilled. This broken heaven and earth will pass away. Our broken bodies will be resurrected in His glory. We will be with the Lord forever in the new heaven and new earth. Our lives in Advent are full of looking forward and backwards.

However, Advent also calls us to focus on the present also. During Advent, we recognize that our Lord is still with us. He still provides us with all we need for our bodies and our souls. He also calls us to continue to trust in His promises. His promises in our Baptisms tell us that He has redeemed our souls and the crown of life is waiting for us. His promises in the Supper tell us that He continues to forgive and strengthen us with His own body and blood. In His Word, we receive the assurance of what awaits us in Christ's return.

As you journey through this Advent season, do not forget Jesus who calls us to be His people: past, present, and future!

### Overjoyed by the Star—an article on Stewardship

In Matthew 2, we read about the Visit of the Magi. Following the star, inquiring at the king's palace, informed by the priests where to find the Child, they trudged with determination to Bethlehem, bringing with them the gifts they planned to

present as they worshiped Him. "When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. On coming to the house, they saw the child with His mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped Him. Then they opened their treasures and presented Him with gifts of gold and of incense and of myrrh" (Matthew 2:10-11)

What did the Wise Men from the East know about this Baby or His Family? Not much. Yet they came in faith, bringing gifts with them to honor Him. How far did they travel? How long was their trip? We can surmise, but what's important to know is that, for them, the trip with all its drudgery was worth it. "They were overjoyed."

How long a trip are we prepared to make this Christmas to worship the Christ Child? Are we willing to put up with inconvenience and sacrifice in order that we might come before Him with our gifts, offering them in faith, as the Wise Men did?

What causes our joy this Christmas season? It is seeing the eyes of little children light up when they open their presents? That's good. Is it finding exactly the right gift for someone special? That's good, too. But are we "overjoyed" when we see the star? Contrary to the messages we hear in the commercials and even the seasonal songs, the only thing Christmas is about is the birth of Jesus, the Savior of the world.

Along with doing all the wonderful things that are good to do at this time of the year, including the visiting of sick and the homebound, the baking of goodies for food banks, the sharing of financial resources with those in need, and all the shopping and caroling and everything else, let's find our joy in seeing the star. That star points us to Jesus and leads us to the Cross. Let us "open our treasures" and worship Him with our best and most precious gifts as the Wise Men did.
