#### It is My Life... Isn't it?

For if I rebuild what I tore down, I prove myself to be a transgressor. For through the law I died to the law, so that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. I do not nullify the grace of God, for if righteousness were through the

law, then Christ died for no purpose. (Galatians 2:17-21)

Bon Jovi sang the following in a popular song of the 2000's:

It's my life It's now or never I ain't gonna live forever I just want to live while I'm alive My heart is like an open highway Like Frankie said I did it my way I just want to live while I'm alive It's my life!



The substance of these lyrics have become an anthem of American society over the last decades. Throughout our lives, we are taught that our happiness is of utmost importance. We are taught that we

are individuals with our own truths, our own thoughts, and our own lives. No one can tell us what is true for us. No one can infringe upon our opinions, our identities, or any aspect of our lives. Our pride and self-esteem are then, necessarily, attached to the ability to function as an individual amongst other individuals. My opinions are



only accepted when they do not disagree or differ from the opinions and life of someone else. It becomes unimportant and, to a certain extent, immoral to try to convince others of my opinions because they are only true for my life.

However, the Scriptures remind us that the base assumption of this way of thinking is incoherent with the truth of God. Our lives are not our own. When a Christian receives the gift of faith in Christ via baptism or the Word, the Christian's life is killed, and a new life is given... a life that belongs to Christ. We have been crucified with our sins with Christ. And Christ, through faith, lives in us. We are called to live by faith in the Son of God who gave His life for us. Since we live in Christ forever, we no longer are bound to only worry about ourselves and we are free to be stewards of God's blessings to us. Our blessings of time, talents, treasures, and everything else are used for serving our neighbors. God takes care of us, and, then, uses us to care for our neighbors. Our lives are not our own. They were bought with a price that grants us freedom, and unites us with the entirety of the people of God. We are no longer individual people, but part of the body of Christ in the world. The life we now live in the flesh we live by faith in Son of God who loved us and gave Himself for us.

St. Paul wrote to the Church of Christ in Corinth: "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Cor 9:7). *God loves a cheerful giver*. But who is a cheerful giver?

Abel was. By faith, Abel gave the firstborn of his flock, and it was acceptable in God's sight. Abraham was. By faith, Abraham prepared cakes and a tender choice calf for God and entertained angels unaware. So also were David and Solomon. By faith, David would not make a sacrifice to God that cost him nothing, so he paid Araunah his due. By faith, Solomon built a house for God, where his name would dwell and thereby where He would dwell to be Israel's God and they His people.

What more shall I say? For time would fail me to tell of all those who gave not simply for the joy of giving but for the joy of knowing the One to whom they gave.

So also our Lord, who for the joy set before Him, gave everything, yes, even His life, enduring the cross and scorning its shame. He gave to the shedding of His blood, willingly and resolutely setting His face toward Jerusalem to die for the life of the world. Though He was rich in every way, He became poor, so that by His poverty we might be rich beyond measure.

So then, let us – like Abel and Abraham, like David and Solomon, and even like our Lord Jesus Christ – give cheerfully to God for the work of His kingdom in our midst. Like them, let us decide in our heart – for the joy set before us – the joy of knowing the One to whom we give is the One who gives us all good things.
