A Christian's Pondering

"And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger. And when they saw it, they made known the saying that had been told them concerning this child. And all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured up all these things, pondering them in her heart". (Luke 2:16-19)

When is the last time you pondered something? When is the last time that you took time to actually consider and allow your thoughts to dwell on something? something? Was it a large purchase? Was it a major life decision? Was it whether to cook dinner or go out to eat? In our society and lives, we are so good at being occupied and busy that we often do not take the time to ponder. When the COVID pandemic began and the restrictions began, I thought that if there was ever going to be a sil-

ver-lining to all of this, it was going to be that we would all settle down a bit. Maybe I would get some reading or writing done. Maybe I would get some home projects done. But a truth of life is that if you do not make time for something during normal circumstances, you will not make time for it in extraordinary circumstances either.

Mary had just gone through the absolute craziest 9 months of her life. She had been visited by angels. She was made mysteriously pregnant by God. This child was to be the Messiah. Her and her husband made the trip to Bethlehem at a time when the baby could come at any minute. There were no rooms for them to stay the night. She had to sleep in the stable. And then she gave birth. And then the shepherds, who she did not know, came to visit. They told her of visions of multitudes of angels telling them about this very child.



This would have been enough to test the mental strength of anyone of us. Yet, Mary did not freak out. She did not stress. She did not move on to the next thing. She did not continue with her list of responsibilities to take her mind off of the immensity of her situation. She listened to the words that God told the shepherds. She treasured them. She took a minute to ponder these things in her heart. She dwelt on the words of God as they came to her through the mouths of these shepherds.

As we begin a new church year with the season of Advent and uncertainty continues in the world, may we follow the example of Mary. May we always take time to listen to the Word of God. May we take time to ponder the immensity of what it says about that little child born in Bethlehem. May we ponder what that child means for us. He means that our sins are forgiven. He means that the craziness of this world is temporary. He means that we are never alone, and that place in God's family is certain. May we ponder the sacredness of the season. May ponder the blessings that God gives us each week, day, and hour. May we ponder what Christians ponder... God's words and promises.

Next time you see me, please share your favorite Christmas song; I am always curious.

I hope you are getting ready for Christmas. Before you groan, hear me out. When I make a statement like this, I mean something TOTALLY different than many people who would tell you the same thing.

The world has Christmas all wrong. When the world tells you to get ready for Christmas they mean: put up a tree in your living room, decorate the tree with lights and ornaments, buy gifts for all your relatives and coworkers, get out the ugly sweaters, stock the pantry with ingredients for cookies and hot cocoa and egg nog, you get the idea.

When I say "I hope you are getting ready for Christmas" I don't mean any of that stuff. The way to actually get ready for Christmas is very different for the Christian. You can get ready by looking around at the brokenness of this world and praying for peace. You can get ready by adding a devotion to your daily schedule. I happen to really enjoy both aspects of Christmas. I really enjoy Christmas music, both secular and religious. I find myself getting swept up in all the "holly jolliness" that the world seems to cling to so tightly, but I also see Jesus everywhere and can take heart in the comfort and peace only he can bring.

My dad wrote a Christmas song called "What Does Christmas Really Mean To Me?" that he has been singing for as long as I can remember, and I think he bridged the gap perfectly between the two. The verses talk abut how much "joy" the world thinks they have found because Christmas is somehow "magical". The chorus transitions into talking about how true hope and joy and peace can only be found in the child born at Bethlehem.

There is nothing magical about Christmas and there is nothing "in the air" during this time of year. However, there is something miraculous that happened 2000 years ago that still affects our lives today. The baby Jesus was born so that we might live.

The next time you find yourself annoyed by the secular Christmas songs you hear at the grocery store or while you shop for gifts, be reminded that while the world is seeking peace and joy in the wrong places we have already found it.
