



## **The Bethlehem Visitor - July 2020**

#### A Life Hidden With Christ

If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory (Colossians 3:1-4).

#### Who are you?

It seems like a rather simple question. It will almost immediately prompt the answer of a name, a family, a nationality, or an occupation. Maybe the more important question asks, "In the list of ways to identify yourself, at what point do you identify yourself as a Christian?" Is it number four in your list? Is it number three? This exercise is not to make you feel guilty. It is to bring to light how much the thinking of the world has infiltrated our thinking. There are so many items, identities, and thoughts that enter our mind before the thoughts and words of our Creator.



Paul pulls no punches when addressing the body of Christ at Colossae. In Scripture, God is very clear about where our identity lies. We are no longer of the world but we have been seated with Christ above. Paul states that we have died, and now our life is hidden in Christ. When Christ returns, our true identity will be seen because our sinful nature will be completely defeated. The identity that is given to us in Baptism cleanses us of our sins before our Creator. God calls us His children, first and foremost. This identity, however, is not just a trump card that we play at death or the end times. It is a way of life that affects everything else in our lives.

Numerous times throughout Scripture, we are urged to set our minds on things that are otherworldly. Paul gives us a brief list off them later in Colossians

"Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him" (Colossians 3:12-17).

These are the fruits of the identity that we have in Christ. We should look different than the world because we are not of the world any longer. We have been bought with a price by the blood of Christ. His death is our death, and His life is our life.

Who are we?

We are Christians. We have many other vocations, but we are Christians first.


Some of my other hobbies include but are not limited to: reading, board games, Sheepshead, learning new skills, and anything that involves strategy.


